# Ostomy Care Now Available

Fatima Hospital's Comprehensive Wound Healing Center has launched a new ostomy care program. Under the direction of **Dr. Gerald Marsocci**, a general surgeon, the program is staffed with a certified wound, ostomy and continence nurse, **Kim Doyon**, who is specifically trained in the care and management of patients with a stoma and who has extensive experience with complex ostomy management issues. **Dr. Andrea Goldfarb** and **Phil Zangale**, **PA**, are also available for consultations.

The program is focused on providing individualized ostomy care, including colostomy, ileostomy, urostomy, and bowel fistula management. Pre and post-operative counseling on stoma care and management (complications include leakage & skin care) are provided to patients on an inpatient and outpatient basis. Evaluation and treatment are also available for patients with feeding or drainage tubes, as well as management and treatment of peristomal skin problems, stomal complications, ill-fitting appliance issues, or common skin complications after surgery. The program includes information, education and support for families and caregivers to increase their understanding, knowledge and management of a patient's condition and the lifestyle adjustments that are necessary after stoma surgery.

Kim Doyon is a certified wound and ostomy specialist with more than 20 years of experience developing and managing ostomy programs. She works for Restorix Health, a recognized leader in wound care and Fatima's partner in managing the wound care program.

# Ankle Arthroplasty Now Available

Total ankle replacement featuring a faster recovery time than other procedures is now available at Roger Williams Medical Center, thanks to the leadership of **Nathalia Doobay, DPM, FACFAS,** Chief of the Division of Podiatry and a physician with Orthopedic Associates.

Total ankle arthroplasty is indicated for patients with end-stage ankle arthritis who meet specific criteria pertaining to age, activity level, and comorbidities. Recovery time is accelerated in comparison to the traditional ankle fusion procedure, affording earlier weight-bearing while maintaining the natural range of motion of the ankle. Like other joint replacement surgeries, physical therapy is utilized post-operatively to optimize recovery.

An important aspect of Dr. Doobay's surgical protocol is the use of Prophecy Preoperative Navigation Guide. Using a combination of computer imaging and the patient's own CT Scan, a surgical blueprint is then developed. Ankle implant sizing and alignment are determined in advance using the patient's anatomic landmarks. This allows for less procedural complexity, less fluoroscopic exposure and reduced surgical time. The procedure is done as an inpatient procedure with one overnight stay.

## **EMS Pearl of the Month July 2021**

An EMS paradigm for the treatment of exertional heat stroke:

- 1. Rapid Recognition-the definition of heat stroke is a core body temperature greater than 104° WITH an altered mental status.
- 2. Rapid Assessment-the valid and feasible method of measuring an accurate core body temperature is a rectal temperature.
- 3. Rapid Cooling-the gold standard for cooling is cold water immersion.
- 4. Rapid Advanced Care- cool first, transport second.

#### ECG of the Month June 2021 Answer



For those of you who recognized the ECG in the June issue was the same ECG as that presented in the May issue, congratulations! There was a production error and the ECG that was supposed to be shown in June was

the ECG above, that of atrial fibrillation. Following our recent EMS Rounds discussion on stroke, patients with Afib have a 17-fold increase in having an ischemic stroke. The woman in the case presented with stroke symptoms and should have been transported to a stroke center or stroke-ready hospital. Ultimately, patients with Afib are typically anticoagulated with Coumadin or one of the newer novel agents (Xarelto, etc.) to protect them from embolic events.
