Health Center Recertified

The St. Joseph Health Center has been recertified as a Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH). Based on a voluntary review process by the widely recognized National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA), patient-centered medical home designation is a model approach to improving primary care delivery. The PCMH aims to improve quality, reduce cost, and improve the experience of patients, caregivers, and health care professionals. In addition to making care safer, it encourages patients to take an active part in their own health care planning and decisions through a direct relationship with their provider to maximize outcomes. The health center, located at 877 Chalkstone Avenue, adjacent to Roger Williams Medical Center, provides pediatric and adult primary care as well as immunization, asthma, and lead clinics.

3. Are there any special considerations for transport?



EMS Pearls of the Month November 2021


Ocular Emergencies:

- Patients with severe ocular injuries can present with normal visual acuity (VA).
- Orbital fractures may be associated with cranial nerve injury, muscle entrapment, or global injuries. Frequent reassessment of VA and EOMs is warranted in patients with suspected orbital fractures.
- Consider consultation with receiving facility regarding timely availability of resources (ophthalmology services). Penetrating global injuries will require emergent in-hospital intervention.



ECG of the Month September 2021 Answer

This is a regular sinus rhythm with no ischemic changes and no ectopy, aka a “normal” ECG. Keep in mind that



you are going to see a lot of normal ECGs in your practice. And it is just as important to know “normal” as it is to identify the pathology in “abnormal” ECGs.

When reporting to the ED about ECGs, it is important to note “no ischemic changes” as this finding dictates transport decisions.

Outpatient Rehabilitation Service Relocates To Fatima Hospital

The Southern New England Rehabilitation Center Outpatient Rehabilitation practice on Mineral Spring Avenue in North Providence has moved to the Fatima campus. All services are now located in the Ambulatory Care Center adjacent to the Emergency Department. Patient access is still through the Central Registration area. This is an ideal location as it offers much more space with handicap accessibility, easy access, and dedicated parking, all in a nice quiet neighborhood. Their expert team of

Laboratory News

Roger Williams Medical Center and Our Lady of Fatima Hospital Laboratories were fully reaccredited following a recent inspection by the College of American Pathologists (CAP). The CAP is the leader in laboratory accreditation and conducts an onsite biennial survey utilizing a peer group inspection model where 7 to 10 of inspectors who specialize in different areas of the laboratory conduct the inspection lead by a Team Leader. Numerous checklists are provided to guide the inspection including references to support compliance and documentation. These checklists represent modern best practices and are continuously updated facilitating laboratories to stay scientifically and operationally current.

NEW Advanced Lab Testing

The Microbiology Laboratory at Fatima has implemented the Accelerate Pheno System for the rapid identification and antimicrobial susceptibility test for positive blood cultures. Testing will include gram positive and gram-negative identification using FISH technology. ID and susceptibility are provided in approximately 7 hours to 24 hours based on positive blood culture identification. This is great news since it will be at a minimum of 24 hours faster than current methods and these rapid results will allow for prompt clinical decisions and treatments.
